

Giant's Causeway

A geological wonder steeped in legend and folklore, Northern Ireland's first UNESCO World Heritage Site, The Giant's Causeway, is home to a wealth of local history and legend. Explore the geological phenomenon of 40,000 basalt stone columns formed by volcanic eruptions over 60 million years ago. Discover the legend of the Giant Finn McCool and search for distinctive stone formations such as the Camel, Wishing Chair, Harp and Organ. The stones and coastal path are open all year. Visitor Experience tickets include Interactive Exhibition, Audio Guide (available in 11 languages), Guided Tours, Gift Shop with Local Crafts, Café, as well as onsite parking. Toilet facilities and Changing Places available within the Visitor Centre. Exterior toilets available at the side of the Causeway Hotel for walkers. Pre-booking online recommended for Visitor Experience tickets. The Giant's Causeway Visitor Experience is open all year except Christmas Eve, Christmas Day and Boxing Day. Last admission 1 hour before closing. Please visit the website for the latest visitor information.

Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge

Take on the exhilarating challenge of the famous rope bridge to Carrick-a-Rede Island and enjoy a truly magnificent cliff top experience. This 30-metre deep and 20-metre wide chasm is traversed by a rope bridge, traditionally erected by salmon fishermen. Visitors bold enough to cross to the rocky island are rewarded with fantastic views across to Rathlin Island as well as amazing flora, fauna and bird life. Washrooms and accessible facilities available on site. Suitable clothing and footwear are recommended. Last entry is 45 minutes before closing. Timed tickets are in operation and visitor numbers may be restricted to access and cross the Rope Bridge. Mussenden Temple & Downhill Demesne

Enjoy a leisurely stroll around the stunning Downhill Demesne with its beautiful, sheltered gardens and cliff walks. Visit the apple orchard in the walled garden and the beautiful 18th-century folly, Mussenden Temple, originally inspired by the Tivoli Temple of Vesta. Start at the Bishop's Gate entrance to the Demesne and enter the Bishop's Gate Gardens. Take the right track and pass through a relict arboretum with many rare tree species. Follow signs for Mussenden Temple and you will soon leave the trees behind to enter an area of open grassland with views of the majestic ruins of Downhill House. You can turn left towards the walled garden or explore the ruin; either way the paths will lead you towards Mussenden Temple perched on the cliff edge. From here you can enjoy dramatic views of the Inishowen Peninsula. Follow the path along the cliff towards the east and you will come to a small collection of trees: take the stile on the left side. Steps lead you down to the pond and back to Bishop's Garden.

Finish with a coffee and sweet treat from Al's Coffee. Grounds open all year. Facilities include car park, toilets and light refreshments. See website for opening times.

Parking at Lion's Gate is paid by PayByPhone app. Picnic tables are available at Lion's Gate.

Fully accessible grounds, mown grass paths, gravel paths, slight undulating terrain and some steep steps. Dogs are welcome.
Accessible toilet at Lion's gate available - please ensure accompanying adult knows when using facilities in case of emergency.

Hezlett House

This single-storey thatched cottage dates from c.1691 when it was probably built as a parsonage for the rector of Dunboe. The house is particularly interesting for its cruck construction, a form not often seen in Northern Ireland at this date. Several areas in the house are left bare to expose the cruck trusses and other structural details. In 1761 the house was acquired by a Presbyterian farmer, Isaac Hezlett, whose family continued to live there until the National Trust acquired the property in 1976. Open every third weekend of the month with guided tours. Opening hours: 11am-4pm

Dunluce Castle Explore Dunluce Castle, one of the most picturesque and romantic of Irish castles. With evidence of settlement from the first millennium, the present castle ruins date mainly from the 16th and 17th centuries. It was inhabited by both the feuding McQuillan and MacDonnell clans. Historical and archaeological exhibits are on display for your viewing. Guided tours and self-guiding available. No dogs permitted except assistance dogs. Regular opening hours are: February to November: daily 9.30am to 5pm. December to January: daily 9.30am to 4pm. Note: Last admission is 30 minutes before closing. The site is on a steep gradient with various ground surfaces (eg, grass and cobbles) and may not be suitable for those with limited mobility. The castle has different levels which are only accessible by steps. Rathlin Island is an iconic landmark off the northern coastline of County Antrim and forms part of the panorama of the Causeway Coastal Route. It lies just six miles off the coast from Ballycastle. The high sea cliffs lend an aura of mystery and induce the urge to explore what lies beyond, but arguably, its greatest asset is the breeding seabird colony. The island also boasts significant natural heritage sites and is internationally important for its flora and, in some cases, its unique marine life. Visitors' cars are restricted, and the roads are quiet and ideal for walking and cycling. On the island you can follow the Sustrans National Cycle Network Route 93 to the West Lighthouse, East Lighthouse and Rue Lighthouse or follow any of eight walking trails. To reach the island, take the ferry from Ballycastle Harbour to Church Bay, Rathlin. There are two ferries and the journey will take no longer than 40 minutes. You can choose to do a round trip in a day or stay a while and enjoy unique accommodation and hospitality. The island's strong cultural heritage, with storytelling songs and music is legendary.

RSPB Rathlin West Light Seabird Centre

Experience the hustle and bustle of Rathlin's seabird city as thousands of birds raise their chicks, which are placed precariously on the cliff edges at the West Light Seabird Centre. This seabird colony is a crowd pleaser, especially when everyone's favourite, the puffin, makes an appearance, with May to July being the best time to see them. Access is via ferry from Ballycastle, then by private bus, or, if preferred, a scenic 4½-mile hike or cycle across the island. Visit Rathlin Island's famous 'upside down' lighthouse – a member of The Great Lighthouses of Ireland partnership. Please note that there are 98 steps down (and up) to the seabird viewing platform and a further 64 to the bottom of the lighthouse. Pony rides on the beach for children and adults from only £6.50pp. Arrive, select your helmet and get acquainted with your horse. Then mount and take time to get comfortable and familiar with your new friend. You will be given instructions about riding and safety before riding out. The horses are led by a trekking guide on foot, who can answer any questions and assist you during the trek. Once the trek has been completed, the guide will help each rider dismount one at a time. 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Galboly, The Glens of Antrim Runestone

Situated above Garron Point on the Causeway Coastal Route, the hidden village of Galboly is where Sansa and Littlefinger watch Robin practise his swordsmanship in Season 5 Episode 1. In Season 6 Episode 4, Littlefinger and Robin agree to march to Sansa's aid with the Knights of the Vale. Please note this site is on private land.

Cushendun Caves A Cove in the Stormlands

In the quaint village of Cushendun, at the mouth of the River Dun, you will find the magnificent caves that were formed over 400 million years ago. They were used in Season 2 Episode 4 when Melisandre gave birth to the shadow creature which goes on to kill Renly Baratheon. Please note this site is on private land.

Fair Head Dragonstone Cliffs

This rocky headland rises 600ft above sea level and lies just three miles from the town of Ballycastle. In Season 7 Episode 3, Varys confronts Melisandre here about her avoidance of Jon Snow before advising her to leave Westeros forever. It's also where Jon, Daenerys and Drogon share a moment together in Episode 5, and latterly Tyrion and Daenerys in Episode 6.

The Dark Hedges The Kingsroad

The intertwining beech trees on this avenue are over 200 years old and were planted by the Stuart family to impress visitors as they approached Gracehill House. The Dark Hedges were used in Season 2 Episode 1 as Arya escapes King's Landing along the Kingsroad. Please note that parking is not permitted along the Bregagh Road. Parking available at the Hedges Estate for cars and buses, charges may apply.



Larrybane, The Stormlands and Nagga's Hill, Old Wyk

This dramatic headland, sheltered by Sheep Island, offers views of the spectacular Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge. It was used in Season 2 Episode 3 as Renly Baratheon's camp, and where Brienne was named to Renly's Kingsguard. In Season 6 Episode 5 it was the setting for the Kingsmoot.

Downhill Strand Dragonstone

Seven miles of sand beneath the stunning Mussenden Temple, that sits perched dramatically on a 120ft cliff top. In Season 2 Episode 1 this is where Melisandre burnt the effigies of the Seven Gods of Westeros.

Murlough Bay Slaver Bay and Renly's Camp

The wild and windswept cliffs above Murlough Bay is where brothers Stannis and Renly met in Season 2 Episode 4. On the bay, Tyrion and Jorah were captured by slavers in Season 5 Episode 6.





Portstewart Strand Coast of Dorne

The 2-mile stretch of golden beach at Portstewart Strand is backed by impressive sand dunes. Here Jaime and Bronn came ashore to rescue Myrcella only to be discovered by Dornish soldiers. It's also where Ellaria and the Sand Snakes vow vengeance against the Lannisters in Season 5 Episode 4.



Ballintoy Lordsport Harbour and Pyke

This coastal harbour at the end of a dramatic, twisting road is synonymous with Pyke and the Iron Islands. Theon returns here in Season 2 Episode 2 and is baptised here in Season 2 Episode 3. Season 6 Episode 5 also features Euron's drowning and rebirth here, and the nearby beach played host to Melisandre's burning of Stannis Baratheon's bannerman.





Binevenagh, The Antrim Plateau Dothraki Grasslands

Marking the western extent of the Antrim Plateau, this distinctive headland has spectacular cliffs extending for over 6 miles across the peninsula of Magilligan. Used in Season 5 Episode 10 when the Dothraki horde surround Daenerys after her escape from the Meereen fighting pits on the back of Drogon, and again in Season 6 Episode 1 when Daario and Jorah discover Daenerys' ring whilst searching for her.

A hilly trail on the picturesque Glenullin Valley, exploring the Errigal landscape and Garvagh forest.



The Lower Bann Cycleway (45 miles)

Cycle between Toome and Castlerock following the Lower Bann River corridor from Lough Neagh to where the river enters the Atlantic Ocean at The Barmouth near Castlerock.



Bann Valley Cycle Route (15 miles)

Linking Garvagh and Kilrea on quiet country roads, this route traverses the fertile landscape of the Bann Valley, with views beyond towards the Antrim Hills.



The Banagher Cycle Route (28 miles)

A challenging trail, circling the foothills of the Sperrin Mountains and passing through uplands, farmlands, towns and villages.

Walking The Causeway Coast and Glens is a haven for walkers. Each and every turn opens up a myriad of sights, smells and sounds, creating the ultimate

The Moyle Way (27 miles/43km)

The Moyle Way, connecting the coastal settlements of Ballycastle and Waterfoot, runs through the heart of the Glens of Antrim, taking the walker through an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and a land of geology, wildlife, history and folklore. Following a mixture of forest tracks and remote upland moor, the 42km route traverses the slopes of Trostan, Antrim's highest summit at 550m. The mountain sections can be wet and rough underfoot, and full navigation skills are required in bad weather.

The Causeway Coast Way (33 miles/52km)

The Causeway Coast Way takes walkers along Northern Ireland's most celebrated coastline, connecting the coastal resorts of Portstewart and Ballycastle. The 52km route includes sandy beaches, dramatic cliff paths, iconic viewpoints and world famous historic and natural landmarks. With frequent access points, including car parking and facilities, and terrain suitable for all fit walkers, this route provides walking opportunities for a wide range of users.



The North Sperrins Way (37 miles/60km)

Connecting Dungiven and Castlerock this route provides an upland trail experience across open mountain and forest. It traverses higher ground forming the northern foothills of the Sperrin Mountains, passing notable landscape features including Benbradagh and Binevenagh, with spectacular views over Lough Foyle towards Donegal.



International Appalachian Trail

For the ultimate challenge, walkers can follow the 284 miles / 457km International Appalachian Trail UlsterIreland that traverses the Causeway Coast and Glens. The Ulster-Ireland chapter of the International Appalachian Trail is part of one of the world's largest trail networks and includes stunning landscapes, world-class attractions and experiences whilst taking in Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty, World Heritage sites, forestry and stunning coastlines. The Glens of Antrim

Endowed with evocative names and blessed with a diversity of landscape, The Glens are rich in history, folklore and natural beauty. Each named according to their attributes. Escape to a world away from the frantic bustle of modern life and explore the woods, waterfalls, riverside paths, viewing points and forest parks among Glencloy (the glen of the hedges), Glenarm (the glen of the army), Glenariff (the fertile glen), Glenballyeamon (the Edwardstown glen), Glencorp, (the glen of the slaughtered), Glenann (the glen of the colt's foot), Glendun (the glen of the brown river), Glenshesk (the sedgy glen) and Glentaisie (the glen of Taisie of the bright sides). This section brings you along the coast from Waterfoot, through Cushendall and Cushendun, to Ballycastle and Rathlin Island, before sweeping inland to Armoy and the nearby Dark Hedges. There is no doubt this area contains some of the most striking and varied scenery in Northern Ireland.

Places of Interest



Waterfoot Beach BT44 0JE

Backed by sand dunes, it is a conservation area known for the presence of the Yellowrattle flower and the Small Copper butterfly.



Murlough Bay BT54 6RG

Buzzards and peregrine falcons hunt along the cliff tops at Murlough Bay, while eider and fulmar skirt along the bottom. There are different-level car parks and picnic areas to enjoy the breath-taking views.



Torr Head BT54 6RQ

A remote headland with jaw-dropping vistas stretching over the North Channel as far as Scotland (on a clear day).



Loughareema Lake BT44 0TA

A natural phenomenon—a sparkling oasis one day and just a few days later, a bed of cracked mud with not a drop of water in sight.



Fair Head BT54 6RD

It is a ruggedly beautiful and remote area for climbers and walkers. As Northern Ireland's tallest cliff face, Fair Head is believed to be the biggest expanse of climbable rock in either Ireland or Britain. A series of walks begins at the farm car park (nominal charges apply) which is clearly signposted off the Fairhead Road. Anglers should also note that the Fair Head lakes are stocked with trout and can be fished during the summer months. The Cliff-Hanger Coffee Hut is located at Fairhead carpark so you can combine your beautiful walk with a sweet treat and coffee.



Ballypatrick Forest (Grid reference: D181359)

Located on the main A2 road before the intriguing Loughareema and the Glens of Antrim, the forest includes off-road car parking, picnic areas and a waymarked walking trail. Watch out for occasional glimpses of the elusive red squirrel and sika deer. 'Touring in the Trees' caravan site is next to the car park.



Craicntour

Guided taxi tours of the Glens of Antrim by local man John Robbin, a third-level history graduate with a family presence in the area dating back some 400 years. John has a keen interest in local customs, folklore and wildlife and an abundance of witty stories to tell. Known locally as 'The Capital of the Glens', Cushendall is a beautiful conservation town at the foot of Lurigethan Mountain.

A prominent feature of the town built in 1817 by Francis Turnly.



Red Bay Castle

The ruins of the castle, reputedly built by Sir James MacDonnell lie on the outskirts of the town and date back to around 1561.



Layde Old Church BT44 0NH

The chief burial place of the MacDonnell Clan (after Bonamargy Friary, see page 40).



Cottage Wood

Surround yourself in the peaceful setting of the 10-acre Cottage Wood, where you can enjoy a series of interesting walks, viewpoints, picnic facilities and playparks with occasional glimpses of red squirrels.



The Cliff Path BT44 0NG

This attractive coastal path hugs the cliffs to the north of Cushendall and offers spectacular views of the Scottish coast, Lurigethan, Red Bay Castle and the Garron Plateau.



Glenariff Forest Park, BT44 0QX

Glenariff Forest Park is a magical experience. 1,000 hectares of planted woodland, lakes, outdoor recreation spaces and conservation areas; catering for many outdoor activities including walking, horse riding and touring. Fuel your activities at the picnic and barbeque areas or the tea house. Make the most of your visit by staying overnight in a touring vehicle. Known as the Queen of the Glens, Glenariff Forest is home to many animals of conservation concern, most notably the red squirrel, hen harrier and Irish hare. There are several walking trails through the forest which give spectacular views and glimpses of wildlife, including the 3km Waterfall Walk Trail which twists and turns through Glenariff Nature Reserve. The forest is open daily for visitors on foot. 24 hours a day, but the car park gates are locked at night. Gates open by 8.00am daily and are locked at dusk. The caravan site can be booked through nidirect.gov.uk. Experience Afternoon Tea at the Glenariff Teahouse, offering not just magnificent views but a mouth-watering menu of home-made food sourced from local ingredients. Opens Easter until September.



Cushendun

Between Cushendall and Ballycastle is the pretty village of Cushendun, managed by the National Trust and most notable for its unusual Cornish style cottages (the work of Clough William Ellis).





Ballycastle

Ballycastle (three times crowned the Best Place to Live in Northern Ireland by The Sunday Times) is a small seaside town, where tradition and culture run parallel with modern living. The popular beach runs from the pier at Ballycastle Marina at the western end to the stunning Pans Rock in the east.

Most of this early woodland has now been clearfelled and replanted, producing a more diverse range of wildlife habitats and offering panoramic views of the coast to the north and Rathlin Island, and on a clear day the Scottish Islands of Islay and Jura are visible.



It too promises extraordinary beauty with spectacular coastal scenery, dramatic cliffs and headlands, and natural rural landscapes as far as the eye can see. Portaneevy Viewpoint BT54 6LR

Located on the B15 near Carrick-a-Rede Rope Bridge, Portaneevy viewpoint has a car park and picnic areas, coastal walk, landscaping and cliff-edge viewing platforms. 
Portbraddan Harbour BT57 8TA

Portballintrae is a seaside village close to Bushmills with a small sandy beach and pretty harbour area. There is a car park, picnic area, toilets and shop adjacent to the beach. Popular with families with small children, it is not suitable for swimming due to dangerous conditions. The small harbour is a focal point for many water activities in the village. Runkerry Beach is also a wonderful place to explore but is not suitable for bathing or water sports due to rip currents.

The village has close associations with La Girona, one of 24 ships from the 1588 Spanish Armada that were wrecked along the Irish coast. Its treasure, recovered by divers during the 1960s and brought ashore at Portballintrae, can be viewed today in Belfast's Ulster Museum.

The village also acts as a trailhead for many wonderful coastal walking opportunities, including the section of the Causeway Coast Way providing off-road walking to the Giants Causeway, approx. 1.5 miles away.



Magilligan Point Nature Reserve BT49 01 P

Located close to the tip of one of the largest sand dune systems in the British Isles, the cycling of sand around the foreland and out to the Tunns Bank at Magilligan Point has been going on for centuries. Visitors will be treated to excellent views of seabirds using the narrows and in winter, migrating waders and wildfowl.



Dungiven

The market town of Dungiven (meaning Given's Fort) lies nine miles south of Limavady, near the foot of Benbradagh Mountain. The surrounding areas contain many places of historical significance including Dungiven Castle. The first castle was built by the O'Cahan clan but the existing structure was constructed by Robert Ogilby in the 1800s. It now operates as a Gael Scoil and is not open to the public.

Dungiven Priory and O'Cahan's Tomb BT47 4PF

The ancient Augustinian Priory was founded by the O'Cahan Clan in AD1100 and occupies a picturesque site 200ft above the River Roe.

This impressive ruin is a religious site dating from the late 11th or early 12th century. Legend has it that sand gathered from a nearby tomb brings the beneficiary good luck!



Bovevagh Old Church BT47 4NP

Commonly interpreted as deriving from Maeve's Church, this church has been in ruins since 1622.

An intriguing example of late Neolithic stone circles and alignments. The most southerly of the circles is the most complete with a total of 42 stones



Benbradagh Mountain

Lying within the Sperrin Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty, it is steeped in folklore, while the summit offers a panoramic view over the Sperrins, Roe and Bann Valleys and into Donegal.



Tannyranny Church

Located on the slopes of Benbradagh the remains of this old church date back to the 18th century.



Banagher Glen and Forest

Three miles south of Dungiven, off the B74 is a secluded, steep wooded glen leading to Altnaheglish Reservoir and Banagher Dam. Walkers will be inspired as they navigate a route through one of the oldest ancient oak woodlands in Ireland. Banagher Glen is a Nature Reserve and Special Area of Conservation.

Open daily, Cashel Rainbow Trout Fishery provides some of the best angling in Europe.
