Klampit, the recycling lobster: Paddy Bloomer's popular installation on the seafront

Wandering Bandstand: Back by popular request. Come and peddle this extraordinary contraption and recycle a few musicians along the seafront

Sea Dragon Vikings: Back on Rathlin by invitation for a weekend of rowing, beach battles, taster sessions (daytimes only, weather dependent)

Causeway Coast Maritime Heritage Group: Taster sessions and storytelling sessions on Colmcille (large currach), rope-throwing skill sessions and oar-making on the seafront. Watch for local information (CCMHG Gazebo, Boathouse Museum and Visitor Information Centre, and social media), as weather and tides may shift water activities.
